Questions and answers

Why is Sun Life asking for this information?

Canadian financial institutions are required under Part XVIII (Foreign Account Tax Compliance Act, also known as FATCA) and Part XIX (Common Reporting Standard, also known as CRS) of the Income Tax Act (Canada) to collect the information we're asking about on this form. We may share your information with the Canada Revenue Agency (CRA). CRA, in turn, may share that information with the tax authorities of the jurisdiction(s) that you're a resident of for tax purposes. If you're a citizen of the United States, the CRA may share this information with the U.S. tax authorities.

What happens if I don't provide this information by the required date?

If you don't respond by the required date, we'll assume you're a non-Canadian resident for tax purposes. We may also report your information to the CRA. We will also suspend your non-registered annuity payments, based on FATCA and CRS guidance. This means that you would not receive your money, after the above date.

If you don't provide a TIN (including your social insurance number), the CRA may impose a financial penalty.

How do I know what my jurisdiction of tax residence is?

Generally, an individual will be a resident for tax purposes in a jurisdiction if, under the laws of that jurisdiction (including applicable tax treaties), they pay or should be paying tax there because of their domicile, residence, or any other criteria of a similar nature. This applies regardless of whether the individual is required to file a tax return there. To resolve cases of dual tax residence, individuals who are tax residents in more than one jurisdiction can rely on the tie-breaker rules in tax treaties (when they apply).

What is a TIN or functional equivalent?

A tax identification number (TIN) or functional equivalent is a unique combination of letters or numbers a country assigns to an individual for the purposes of administering the tax laws of that country. Some jurisdictions don't issue TINs. For Canadian residents in Canada, a social insurance number (SIN) is a TIN. If you don't have a TIN, you have 90 days to apply for one. Once you receive it, you then have 15 days to provide it to us.

What government-issued identification will Sun Life accept?

If we have an incorrect jurisdiction listed for you, please send us a copy of valid identification issued by an authorized government body. The ID needs to include your name and address. Acceptable forms of ID include your passport, national identity card, driver's license, citizenship card, or permanent residence card.

Example 1

We've identified you as being a tax resident of France. If this is correct, please provide us with your French TIN. You don't need to provide a copy of your government-issued ID.

Example 2

We've identified you as being a tax resident of France. If this is incorrect, please provide us with your correct jurisdiction and TIN. You'll also need to send us a copy of an appropriate government-issued ID for that jurisdiction.
